Faculty Survey Results

- Fred shared the survey results to determine a ranking of five possible Professional Development sessions on Generative AI for this spring.
- Results (ordered 1 thru 5)
 - 1. Detecting AI-generated content and preventing misuse (recommending best AI detections and how to guide students regarding the ethical use of AI)
 - 2. How to integrate AI into everyday classroom activities (examples: how to write a prompt, uses of AI, how to choose the right AI for what you want to do, and how to promote ethical use of AI)
 - 3. Use of AI for content generation (quizzes, lesson plans, presentations, etc.)
 - 4. Use of AI to automate grading and provide personalized student feedback
 - 5. Developing an AI chatbot specific to your course

Faculty Professional Development

- The committee currently lacks the expertise to develop professional development (PD) sessions and needs additional training and AI exposure, as there is presently no campus-wide AI solution.
- Faculty training is essential, with options like the ACUE 9-month AI training course (\$1800) or shorter, more affordable sessions, both requiring funding support.
- Assigning a faculty member with release time or an additional assignment is recommended to lead the project, given current committee members' full teaching and committee loads. VPAA Approval is needed. A Spring 2025 start could then develop initial sessions and a Canvas-based course.
- Contracting external providers for initial training is an option, with Fred exploring possibilities and referencing other campuses with established PD sessions.

Showcase Classroom Subcommittee:

- Mike shared an initial concept rendering of SIER 204, prompting committee discussion about the showcase classroom project.
- Faculty expressed strong interest and emphasized the need for increased student engagement and a move away from traditional "on-the-stage" lecture-based teaching.
- An upcoming meeting with two showcase project firms, AVI and ACT, will gather faculty input on desired features for the room, with details to be sent via email.

New Business:

- Bill will be conducting Wednesday listening posts at TMCC campus locations on the AI Resource Website currently under development.
- Olga requested an agenda item for next time: Provide "loaner" laptops to all tenured faculty or at least to the 10 serving as committee chairs for Faculty Senate.
