Public Comment

Lars expressed concerns about the difficulty in getting academic curriculum changes approved by the committee, particularly when the administration disagrees. He argued that every proposal that doesn't violate code should reach the floor of the committee. Stephanie and Melissa explained that the current workflow was modeled after the previous paper-based system and has been in place for a long time. They also mentioned some minor changes, such as Jeff's built-in checks to ensure approval by the Academic Affairs Council or Board of Regents.

Lars expressed concerns about the academic changes to courses, particularly the veto of a proposal to change from S/U grading to A-F grading by the A&R Director. Stephanie clarified that the grading system was an issue to take up with NSHE. A former committee chair, provided historical context, stating that the current process has been in place for 30 years and Lars should address his concerns with the relevant parties.
