



FY24 Grant Highlights

The Grants Team writes and submits proposals for external funding from private, federal and state sources. In FY 2024, the Grants Team submitted 38 grant proposals for federal, state, local government and private/non-profit awards and received 39 awards, totaling \$12,140,812.

Once TMCC receives notification of a grant award, the Grants Team serves as the central coordination point and ensures compliance with federal, state and institutional requirements, and policies.

Following are a few exciting grant-funded projects currently going on at TMCC:

TMCC received over \$2.6 million in grant funding from the Nevada Governor's Office of Economic Development's WINN fund aimed at enhancing and expanding TMCC's Automotive, Logistics, Data Science, Advanced Manufacturing, Machining, Diesel, and Welding programs. These awards are intended to upgrade and purchase new equipment, develop curriculum enhancements that will better prepare students for the evolving demands of these industries and enhance marketing and outreach.

The National Science Foundation (NSF) awarded TMCC a five-year grant to enhance engineering education. This grant supports a collaboration with the University of Nevada, Reno, Western Nevada College, and Great Basin College to improve transfer processes for engineering students, and ultimately prepare students for successful careers in the engineering field. This marks TMCC's first leadership role for an NSF grant.

Partment of Labor Building Pathways to Infrastructure Jobs Grant. The purpose is to create and sustain new apprenticeship programs to strengthen the region's workforce and meet the needs of the burgeoning advanced manufacturing sector.
